1 - 19	Daniel is reading then prays, repents, and confesses his and Israel's sins against God. He asked for God's Mercy.	(See the Scripture) The chapter begins with Daniel reading the words of Jeremiah that Israel would be in captivity 70 years. Knowing that Israel was about to be released from captivity, Daniel prayed for his sins and acknowledged Israel's sins against God and asked for God's mercy.
20 - 23	The angel, Gabriel, interrupted Daniel's praying and explained to him God's plans for Jerusalem, the temple and for the Jewish people.	²⁰ While I was speaking and praying, confessing my sin and the sin of my people Israel and making my request to the LORD my God for his holy hill— ²¹ while I was still in prayer, Gabriel, the man I had seen in the earlier vision, came to me in swift flight about the time of the evening sacrifice. ²² He instructed me and said to me, "Daniel, I have now come to give you insight and understanding. ²³ As soon as you <u>began to pray, a word went out, which I have come to tell you, for you are highly esteemed.</u> Therefore, consider the word and understand the vision:
24	70 x 7 = 490 years During these years the Lord will command/accomplish 6 specifics for the Jewish people. 1 st 3 dealt with sin and the last 3 with righteousness.	²⁴ "Seventy 'sevens' ^[e] are decreed: 1) for your people and your holy city to finish ^[e] transgression, 2) to put an end to sin, 3) to atone for wickedness, 4) to bring in everlasting righteousness, 5) to seal up vision and prophecy and 6) to anoint the Most Holy Place. ^[e] (The 1st three have been fulfilled while the last will happen in the future events.)
25	7 x 7 = 49 Years 62 x 7 = 434 Years 69 weeks to restore and rebuild the Jerusalem	²⁵ "Know and understand this: From the time the word goes out to restore and rebuild Jerusalem until the Anointed One, ^[f] the ruler, comes, there will be seven 'sevens,' and sixty-two 'sevens.' It will be rebuilt with streets and a trench, but in times of trouble.
26	At the end of 434 years, Christ's Crucifixion & Resurrection. Gap-In the Dispensation of the Church Age, The Rapture will follow.	^{26a} After the sixty-two 'sevens,' the Anointed One will be put to death and will have nothing. ^[g] (The Parenthetical, Parenthesis, Indeterminate Gap – An interruption, interval) ^{26b} The people of the ruler who will come will destroy the city and the sanctuary. The end will come like a flood: War will continue until the end, and desolations have been decreed.
27	The Tribulation Period Antichrist is on the scene 3.5 Years 3.5 Years	²⁷ He will confirm a covenant with many for one 'seven.' ^[h] In the middle of the 'seven' ^[i] he will put an end to sacrifice and offering. And at the temple ^[i] he will set up an abomination that causes desolation, until <u>the end that is decreed is poured out on him.</u> ^{[k][l]}

Hebrew word for weeks is Shavuot which means "sevens".

1 week = 7 Years

Seventy periods of 7 Years = 490 Years

$$70 \times 7 = 490$$
